

12. Implementation

Every planning document that is prepared should have a section, where proposed actions and resources necessary to implement the plan are outlined. Type of action, responsible actor(s), affected parties and required resources in terms of finances, human resources etc, are typical components of such an implementation programme. If the implementation part of plans is not thoroughly thought through, there is a big risk that the plan will never be realised and thereby more or less a nullity.

However, since this first draft plan proposal for the King Williams Town CUP is prepared during the last weeks of office for the present Council it has been deemed inappropriate to elaborate on an implementation programme at this point in time. Only when the proposals presented in this Draft Report have been discussed, analysed and consent possibly obtained from the responsible Council, it would be worthwhile formulating an implementation program. The basic contents of the program would however be developed around the actions proposed in Chapter 11, Plan Proposal dealing with spatial as well as non-spatial proposals.

As this draft CUP proposal should also be seen as the Land Development Objectives for the King William's Town part of Buffalo City, the implementation programme should also be co-ordinated with the IDP/LDO process for the entire new municipality and the Amatola District IDP/LDO and Land Reform & Settlement Plan.

13. Monitoring and Review

What has been said above about the implementation of the plan is valid also to the setting up of a monitoring and review system. Such a system can only be established once the planning organization and institutional set up is sorted out within Buffalo City.
