CITY WARNS CITIZEN ON DIRE WATER STATE

The Buffalo City Metropolitan Municipality is calling on its residents to use water wisely and sparingly in order to avoid a possible water crisis.

The main dam which supplies East London and Mdantsane, the Briddledrift dam, was recorded to be below 45 percent in the latest available data. The latest figure of this dam is at 40.7 percent. The other dams that supplies the City are Nahoon dam, which supplies East London and Mdantsane and Rooikrantz dam which supplies KWT recorded at 27.8 percent.

Buffalo City's main reserve dam, the Wriggleswade Dam, which is managed by Amatola Water on behalf of the Department of Water and Sanitation, is currently sitting at 35.8 percent.

The latest statistics show a significant drop in dam levels in some of the main dams when compared to the same period in the previous year, which indicates that a BCMM is in a drought situation ,if solid rains do not materialize this summer.
