WELCOME TO THE UMTIZA ARTS FEST 2024!

mtiza Arts Festival is one of the fastest growing Arts, Culture and Heritage spectacles in South Africa's Cultural and Creative Industries (CCi's) Ecosystem today. The name is taken from the Umtiza tree, which is unique to parts of the Eastern Cape. There is currently an Umtiza tree in the East London Museum Garden. This tree was planted as a small seedling in 1960 and flowered for the first time in March 1972. It has three stems symbolising the three partner institutions of the festival: the East London Guild Theatre, the East London Museum and the Ann Bryant Art Gallery.

It represents the burgeoning potential in SA's Creative Economy that can only be unlocked when Public-Private-Partnerships are structured to enable sustainable development. Approaching a decade of existence, our programming for 2024 kicks off on the eve of our important national general election and symbolically marks 30 years of South Africa's democracy by being a resilient ecosystem underpinned by a commitment to cultural diversity. 2024 also marks a new paradigm for culture and tourism in Buffalo City as the metro was finally declared a UNESCO Creative City of Literature on World Cities Day in Paris 2023, joining an important global community - the Unesco Creative Cities Network. This is already demonstrating important shifts in the policy and arts funding landscape that will only serve to enhance Umtiza's aim of igniting the arts in our city. As the city navigates its new designation, Umtiza will serve as one of the important torch bearers on how to best carve an enabling ecosystem for the CCI's to boost tourism and drive creative entrepreneurship in the interests of valuing the arts economically and combating our social ills.

We are proud of the strides over the years that have now been recognised and rewarded by the EC Provincial Department of Sports, Recreation Arts and Culture (DSRAC) and National DSAC. In 2024 Umtiza will embark on a new journey as a designated Provincial Flagship event of the DSRAC. This vote of confidence by the provincial authority is an example of how an entrepreneurial state can foster creativity and innovation. This gesture is already giving confidence to private sector partners to join the effort. We are thankful to our sponsors

and partners and the festival committee that works for weeks and months to bring this all to life.

We must extend our gratitude to the Provincial Department of Sports Recreation, Arts and Culture, MEC Kontsiwe and all the officials who are dedicated to the development of the CCI's, as well as the DSAC and Minister Zizi Kodwa and officials who heeded the call to grant Umtiza Provincial Flagship Status. We salute Buffalo City Metro and Mayor Princess Faku together with the working group who collectively worked on the UNESCO game-changer bid in 2023. Our local media partners have gone above and beyond the call of duty and we have to highlight the deliberate support from Daily dispatch and the Go! There would be no Umtiza Arts Festival today without our partners and sponsors, BCMM, ECDSRAC, DSAC, NAC, ECPACC, Harry's Printers and many more. This year we are delighted to welcome Buffalo Toyota as our new vehicle partner that will drive Umtiza around the city. We also welcome Amathole Museum who join us in collaboration for the first time as they celebrate their 140th anniversary. This helps us extend our programming to be inclusive of the Qonce/KWT community. We also join the EL Museum in celebrating their centenary and encourage you to explore their exciting and enriching programme on offer at this year's festival.

In 2023 we paid tribute to Dr Madosini Latozi Mpahleni and hosted an indigenous ensemble performance and a documentary screening in her name with support from ECPACC. That support is now growing with this year's film programming and will soon evolve into our own Umtiza film festival. In 2024, President Ramaphosa bestowed MaDosini, posthumously, with the The Order of Ikhamanga in Silver for her exceptional service in preserving and elevating indigenous South African musical traditions. We salute her eternal spirit and endeavour to draw inspiration from many like her who, from this province, have dedicated their lives to promoting cultural diversity. The 2024 Festival programme is curated to demonstrate our commitment in that regard.

We warmly welcome you all to this unique, Proudly Eastern Cape Arts Festival that will surely rank highly among key reasons to visit Buffalo City in 2024 and beyond!






